To be eligible for the prize, all team members must meet the minimum 400 work hour requirement as set out in the team project assessment criteria.

This prize is to be awarded to the final year student team that demonstrates the highest overall level of project management and innovation as determined by the award judging panel (comprised of the programme team & industry experts). There are three areas of judging criteria:

Individual Student Grades:

The panel will consider the overall individual project grades of each team member as evidenced across the 5 elements of project assessment criteria. Grades are determined by both the individual and team JIRA performance data, the performance of all team members at the annual exhibition and quality of all supporting design, analysis and management documentation.

Product Innovation:

The panel will consider the innovative quality of the final team game application submitted based on gameplay mechanics, art-style presentation, narrative and design features.

Management & Productivity:

The panel will consider the quality of the team production and productivity data. To be eligible for the prize, all team members must demonstrate both quality and adherence to the SCRUM methodology by way of accurate and consistent sprint & burndown data and the logged hours must be accompanied by appropriate supporting evidence.

N.B. If the successful winner of this prize is also a winner of The Industry Award for Team Management & Innovation in Game Development (Sponsored by Quantum Soup Studios), which consists of 1 year's IGDA Membership and a University prize certificate, the winner will only be eligible to win a maximum of a 2 year's membership to the IGDA for both prizes, regardless of makeup of the individual prizes. A University prize certificate will be awarded for each prize.

The prize itself consists of a 1 year International Game Developers Association (IGDA) Membership for each team member and a University prize certificate.

Institution of Engineering and Technology (IET) Final Year Undergraduate Prize

If students have studied on a route of Automation and Instrumentation (IAIFND) or Electrical (IELFND) these are not eligible to win the prize as these two routes are not accredited by IMECHE due to the lack of Mechanical content.
