## **Welsh Medium Academic Strategy**

## **Key Purpose of Strategy**

The key purpose of this strategy is to increase and enhance academic provision and learning through the medium of Welsh at Wrexham University. We will do this collaboratively with staff, students and non-University bodies based in Wales, and with *Y Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol* as a key partner. The strategy is founded on the principles that the Welsh language is treated on an equal basis<sup>1</sup> and that we are committed to creating a bilingual culture among our staff and students and offer opportunities to succeed through the Welsh language.

## Alignment to V&S, SSSLA and other Supporting Strategies

This strategy is directly aligned to the University's Vision and Strategy, focussing upon

## **Teaching that Inspires:**

To enable inspirational learning through excellent teaching, providing opportunities for our students to flourish as healthy, active and responsible global citizens.

The provision of such teaching has to include Welsh medium teaching and learning, and this Welsh medium strategy will support directly the SSSLA in the enhancement of academic provision at Wrexham University.

## **Structure that Sustains:**

To provide services and operating infrastructure that supports all parts of the strategy; delivering excellence through people, places and resources. Therefore, this strategy will strengthen and support the academic and professional infrastructure to enable enhanced Welsh medium provision.

#### **Introduction and Context**

The Welsh Medium Academic Strategy and action plan is designed to meet the needs of Welsh students and staff at Wrexham University and a growing demand for the provision of Welsh and bilingual education in the Higher Education sector.

Whilst we recognise that there has been a shortfall in the number of students choosing to follow their studies through the medium of Welsh and we have seen a decline in Welsh language provision during the pandemic. Y Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol's new Higher Education Academic plan focuses on safeguarding the opportunities for students to study through the medium of Welsh, offer further opportunities for students to study through the medium of Welsh, offer a broader choice of subject through the medium of Welsh and Welsh opportunities of study to be developed beyond traditional undergraduate provision, e.g., postgraduate and foundation level study. Y Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol's aim is to increase the numbers of students studying through the medium of Welsh and to enhance new bilingual provision across Wales. Y Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol also recognises how the pandemic has shaped new learning experiences across varying technological platforms, which has enabled collaboration to take place between many Welsh universities. These recent changes go hand in hand with the principles of the Active Learning Framework (ALF) at Wrexham University where its principles lie in ensuring optimal flexibility in all aspects of teaching, learning and assessment and offering students and staff the opportunity to collaborate in a hybrid bilingual pedagogic environment.

### **External factors**

## Wrexham University adopts the principles which underpins the work of the:

1. Welsh Language Commissioner

Wrexham University is committed to the Welsh Language Standards, which came into effect at the University in 2017.<sup>2</sup> These standards have enabled significant development in the delivery of front facing services and correspondence as well as the rights of staff, students, and visitors to receive services through the medium of Welsh.

2. Y Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol/The National Centre for Learning Welsh Over the years Wrexham University have maintained an excellent relationship and partnership with Y Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol and the National Centre for Learning Welsh. This enables us to provide provision and training opportunities for our staff and students. These partnerships are set to get even stronger over the next three years as provision and opportunities increase across the university.

#### 3. Welsh Government

The Welsh Government stated in January 2022 that a package of £46 million was to be made available to support the Welsh language in post-sixteen education in Wales through the Renew and Reform programme which focuses on enabling Welsh students to reach their full potential. By also addressing the Welsh Government Cymraeg 2050 targets<sup>3</sup> and The Well-Being Future Generations Wales Act (2015) aims<sup>4</sup>.

## **Priority Aims**

- 1. Review our Welsh medium provision and identify priority areas for development and support.
- 2. Increase the number of learning opportunities for students to study through the medium of Welsh and to protect the right to Welsh medium provision.
- 3. Enhance the Welsh medium support and resources available to staff and students in their teaching and learning and create a learning environment which explicitly recognises and encourages a bilingual academic community.
