Module aims

This module aims to build on practice learning from year 1, applying theory to practice and allowing the student to demonstrate new skills and competencies in an alternative 120-hour youth and community work placement. This module must be successfully completed to gain the JNC professional youth work qualification but does not hold any credit value.

1	Critique the issues and complexities of multiagency working in youth and community work practice
2	Demonstrate professional attitudes, and social and ethical responsibilities in a practice environment
3	Provide a critical evaluation of own performance to identify areas for own professional development

Assessment

Indicative Assessment Tasks:

This section outlines the type of assessment task the student will be expected to complete as part of the module. More details will be made available in the relevant academic year module handbook.

Assessment 1: Attendance – students must maintain attendance of 80% to meet the requirements of the professional qualification

Assessment 2: A Pass/Fail portfolio that builds on portfolio submitted in placement 1. The portfolio will demonstrate the student's professional attitudes and social and ethical responsibilities in a practice environment and demonstrate a critical evaluation of own performance to identify areas for professional development. The portfolio will include:

- Personal statement (updated from placement 1)
- National Occupational Standards Checklist (updated from placement 1)
- Reflective statement outlining key learning from placement 2 in relation to professional attitude and social and ethical responsibilities, critical evaluation of own performance and areas for professional development (1,500 Words)
- Professional Development Plan (updated from placement 1)
- Placement timesheets, and supervisors report

Learning and Teaching Strategies



A variety of teaching and learning activities will be employed on this module, predominantly those that emphasises interactive learning and student participation. These will include practical classes and workshops; case studies and problem-based learning activities, class and small-group discussion, online forums, simulation and group work.

This module will adopt a Hy-Flex approach to teaching and learning, in line with the Active Learning Framework. This means that students can join the classroom in person or join synchronously online to engage in the learning activities. Sessions will also be recorded for students to engage with alongside asynchronous online learning activities to scaffold the learning from the module.
