#### Assessment:

Students will be expected to handle materials and techniques in a confident and competent way in order to realise their own creative intentions. The assessment process will also seek to determine a willingness to experiment or engage with new concepts. Students will be expected to present themselves and their work in a professional manner and to communicate their own concerns cogently and self critically within a peer group environment. They will also be expected to be able to manage time and studio resources effectively. Student outcomes will need to show considered research and the ability to relate work presented for assessment to historical contexts and contemporary issues will be considered crucial.

## **Learning and Teaching Strategies:**

Students will be required to choose from a range of themes, which they can interpret according to their own developing creative personas. They will be asked to examine the relevant themes within a historical context prior to the start of the module. Students will work closely with their own personal tutor and will have the opportunity to have critical feedback on their progress from lecturers. Student-led seminars will explore contemporary and historical themes and serve as a focus for critical debate. Gallery visits will support the practical activity

## Syllabus outline:

The module builds on the students' experience gained within level four and level five so far and serves to establish the student's choice of specialism through a final major project in which they realise personal creative intentions. Through practical and theoretical work, students will consolidate knowledge of visual grammar, expand visual literacy and refine their working vocabulary to increase potency of visual expression. Students must work in the same specialist areas as they did in Extended Practice.

### **Indicative Content**

During this module, students will be encouraged to explore studio practice as a means to realise artistic objectives. They will be required to make themselves aware of contemporary issues and practitioners within the field to identify common themes. At defined points through this module, students will be required to make presentations about their own work, as well as about their own artistic interests to their peer group and staff. This module requires the student to undertake historical research in order to explore conventions from the past, paying particular attention to the role of drawing, as well as to consider contemporary issues, concepts and practices.
