**Learning and Teaching Strategies:**

- Contextualising information regarding narrative structures for this module will be delivered as a keynote lecture/s.
- Assignments will require students to produce coursework that applies their understanding of visual narratives.
- Tutorial guidance, group critique and student seminars will form the basis of the conceptual development and understanding of the student.

**Syllabus outline:**

Students will be introduced to the archetypes and structures of narratives.

Workshops and practical demonstrations will provide the student with the practical skills in the creation of visual narratives, including sequencing, typography, layout, composition, character and colour. Projects will be set to challenge the students to develop their visual storytelling skills and to produce work appropriate to their chosen subject specialism: preproduction work for animation, children's books and comics.

Students will be required to critically self-evaluate their progress throughout the module.
