### Module aims

The content of this module is to establish audio recording principles and content production as applied to the Podcasting medium. The practical sessions will focus the digital process of current practice and will establish key skills required for application of technology within the podcast studio and location-based recording.

The aim of the module is to establish the factors that define quality in content with regard to recording quality, deliverables and other production values. This module will deliver technical

competence within the process of recording, editing and mixing. This module aims specifically to focus on the recording methods required for the various formats for Podcast production
