#### Module aims

An exploration of the theory and practice of documentary filmmaking, focusing on different documentary modes and their techniques. Students will analyse the challenges and creative opportunities presented by documentary storytelling and develop their skills in creating compelling and authentic documentary films.

4	Apply documentary principles and techniques to plan, produce, and critically reflect on original non-fiction film work.

## **Documentary Project**

- 1. **Presentation:** Submit a presentation outlining the conventions of your chosen documentary mode(s), and how it will apply to your own chosen topic. You may include:
  - Influences and style.
  - Historical examples and case studies.
  - Identification of key themes and elements to be explored in the documentary.
  - Discussion of the challenges and opportunities in documenting the chosen subject.
- 2. **Documentary Film Project:** Develop a short documentary film (or films) that employs techniques from the studied documentary modes.

## **Learning and Teaching Strategies**

Instruction and learning are delivered through various methods, including lectures, workshops, seminars, small group tutorials, Q&A sessions and online delivery via ALF. This would include blended learning with accessible online content, prioritising flexibility and inclusivity.



Many classes are exercise-based, promoting active student engagement in their learning process. One-on-one consultations with personal tutors and the presence of regular presentations throughout the course encourages students to engage in reflective learning.

- Analysis of key documentary modes and their techniques (e.g., observational, participatory, reflexive).
- Exploration of ethical challenges and responsibilities in documentary filmmaking.
- Creative strategies for crafting authentic and compelling narratives.
- Practical exercises in documentary pre-production, production, and postproduction.
- Critiques of student and professional documentary works to enhance storytelling skills.
