Module aims

- 2. Establish strategies for a multi-disciplinary, inter-disciplinary and collaborative approach for working as a Graduate Sports Rehabilitator.
- 3. Demonstrate person-centred care while working with service users ensuring clear communication for the best health outcomes.

Assessment

Indicative Assessment Tasks:

Assessment 1: Presentation - Students will undertake a 20-minute presentation with 5-minute viva on presentation content. The presentation will demonstrate the patient management and communication considerations when on placement in the context of a patient case study.

Assessment 2: Portfolio – Students will complete a portfolio which is aligned to BASRaT principles and demonstrates self-appraisal. This will include the completion of 110 hours of placement.

Learning and Teaching Strategies

The module will be delivered using blended learning techniques and the universities Active Learning Framework (ALF). This will include lectures, seminars, peer-led discussions, tutorials, asynchronous tasks and online based quizzes/tasks. Regular feedback will be provided to support the student journey.

As part of the module students will undertake 110 hours of practice where they will be required to attend a relevant experience and complete portfolio tasks to support employability. Students will have tutorials with the module leader for support on placement. Formative feedback will be provided throughout the module to support students development.
