Module aims

This module aims to appraise a variety of approaches to both training and playing curriculum design, whilst also appraising contemporary approaches to development. This module also aims to share insights and approaches from the field and the contemporary nature of this module requires students to approach content with an open mind and indeed position the knowledge exchanged within their own philosophy. This module seeks to challenge existing beliefs and practices in pursuit of a more evidence-based player development methodology.

Module Learning Outcomes

At the end of this module, students will be able to:

1	Critically appraise contemporary methods of player development.
2	Explain the impact the appraised methods of player development have on performance.
3	Investigate the player development pathway of a specific elite football environment.
4	Investigate the player performance pathway of a specific elite football environment.
5	Provide evidence-based recommendations to enhance the development of players and its impact on future performance.

Assessment

Indicative Assessment Tasks:

This section outlines the type of assessment task the student will be expected to complete as part of the module. More details will be made available in the relevant academic year module handbook.

Group Project: Working in a group, the students will create a 45 minute presentation of which provides an appraisal of contemporary methods of player development within football. The presentation will provide details as to how these methods impact on player performance, utilising objective data and contemporary research to support the content of the presentation.

Written Assignment: Students will work independently to undertake a case study approach to this assessment. Students will identify a club or organisation in order to investigate their method of developing players. Using contemporary literature and research, students will highlight key strength and areas of development furthermore, how these recommendations will impact on future performance.
