The module aims to introduce the students to a broad variety of contemporary issues to stimulate discussion, debate, and engagement. It will enable the students to engage with a variety of topic areas with follow-on research activity and reflective practice amongst subject groups.

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Assessment:

Indicative Assessment Tasks:

The assessment will take the form of a portfolio and will typically include:

- Details of topics covered.
- Research undertaken on those topics.
- A reflective account which draws together the student's views and opinions of the lectures considered.

Whilst a number of talks are delivered, students should be encouraged to engage with whichever they are most interested in, therefore their portfolio could include:

10x300 word responses, or, 2x1,500 word responses – or subdivision thereof.

The portfolio (number of written works/word count for each) is therefore negotiable subject to the student's interests.

Learning and Teaching Strategies:

The module will be delivered as a series of lectures that will introduce the students to a range of contemporary issues. The lectures will be followed by a question and answer/ open forum. The session will close with the students attending a seminar session led by a tutor who will address and further discuss the issues relevant to the subject strand.

Syllabus outline:

This core module is designed to be delivered across every FY strand - subject areas are encouraged to share content as appropriate to student base.

The concept is that each sequence of talks allows for follow-on research and discussion among students – to engage, educate, and inspire.
