Module aims

This module is designed to allow students with a strong foundation in the Welsh language to learn linguistic skills that can be adopted in a professional bilingual working environment. The main focus of the module is to refine and further explore linguistic skills and requirements for the workplace. The emphasis of the module is about general communication in a second language, and the development of applied communication skills



in work-based contexts. Students will also explore Welsh legislation, national standards and Welsh culture with reference to their own industry.

Module Learning Outcomes

At the end of this module, students will be able to:

1	Communicate confidently in Welsh using extended sentences and appropriate register in professional workplace scenarios.
2	Translate and interpret more complex Welsh phrases and documents relevant to the student's field of work.
3	Analyse and apply Welsh language strategies and cultural understanding to enhance bilingual service delivery.
4	Evaluate the role of Welsh language policy and legislation in shaping professional practice across sectors.

Assessment

Indicative Assessment Tasks:

This section outlines the type of assessment task the student will be expected to complete as part of the module. More details will be made available in the relevant academic year module handbook.

Assessment 1: Oral presentations based on a series of dialogues – these dialogues will be presented individually and in pairs with the tutor. Students will be assessed individually on their delivery within the pair work; the dialogues will be 20 minutes in length.

Assessment 2: Students will present worksheets based on their line of work and Welsh to English translation as well as an outline of their understanding of Welsh culture and strategies in relation to their own industry.
