Module aims

The module aims to develop and enhance students' confidence and competence in using incidental Welsh within the primary classroom. The module aims to encourage a positive attitude to the Welsh language in the primary curriculum. Learning Welsh gives children an opportunity to broaden their horizons and to learn about the culture of Wales. Children can develop positive attitudes to linguistic and cultural diversity in their school and community through studying Welsh. As well as supporting the Welsh dimension, learning a language stimulates creativity and enjoyment and supports the development of speaking, listening, reading and writing and other basic skills.



Module Learning Outcomes

At the end of this module, students will be able to:

1	Introduce the knowledge and understanding of the requirements for teaching Welsh as a second language in Primary schools.
2	Demonstrate a basic understanding of incidental Welsh and how to introduce Welsh as a second language within the primary setting.
3	Develop confidence in planning and teaching a Welsh activity through demonstration of appropriate pedagogy and resources.

Learning and Teaching Strategies

The lectures will be interactive, practical sessions with a range of activities in Welsh. Students are put in the shoes of the children and are immersed in the language. They have an opportunity to participate a variety of activities and then explore and discuss the different methods used to promote learning. They learn how to create a group activity / resource related to a Welsh festival e.g. Santes Dwynwen / Dydd Gwyl Ddewi encouraging use of Welsh for younger learners.

An active and inclusive approach is used to engage learners in the topics and aligned to the university's Active Learning Framework (ALF), The approach offers students a flexible and adaptive learning experience that will include face to face teaching on campus, a digital learning experience through the Moodle VLE and opportunities to practice whilst out in placement schools.



The Moodle VLE and other on-line materials and resources will be available to support learning. ALF offers digitally enabled activity incorporating flexible and accessible resources and flexible and accessible feedback to support learning.

Students will also engage in this module via the Moodle VLE by sharing their own resources and ideas and being supported additional material on Moodle.

After each lecture, students complete directed tasks which they share with their peers the following week. Students keep a subject audit and resource file to monitor their acquisition of subject knowledge.

Welsh Elements

This is a bilingual module and actively supports and encourages the use of Welsh. Tutorial support, assessment marking and feedback available through the medium of Welsh for all students.

Indicative Syllabus Outline

- An introduction to the continuum of Welsh as a second language across the Primary setting.
- An introduction into the importance of Welsh as a second language and why it is vital in the classroom.
- An introduction to appropriate methodology through a range of activities and practical ideas in Welsh.
- Focusing on Progression Step One when looking at the Curriculum for Wales and what Welsh as a second language is required at this level.
- Become familiar with Welsh festivals, for example, Dydd Gwyl Dewi and Santes Dwynwen and their significance in Welsh culture.
- Become familiar with famous Welsh stories, for example, Gelert and the Mabinogion and their significance in Welsh culture.
- Create an activity or resource based on a Welsh festival or story.
- This module is taught through the medium of English. The assessment of the module, the activity or resource based on a Welsh festival or story, will be through the medium of incidental Welsh.
